**Berks Conservancy will work with Carpenter Cares Volunteers
to clear overgrown section of the Union Canal Trail in Reading**

Saturday, November 13th, 9:00am-1:00pm Stone Cliffe Park and Confluence Point Park

Carpenter Cares volunteers will help the Berks Conservancy clear a section of overgrown brush on the Union Canal Trail between Stonecliffe Recreation Area and Confluence Point Park. The section of trail is overgrown with honeysuckle and overgrown brush and will need to be cleared with chain saws and clippers. The City of Reading will supply their chipper and operator.

Carpenter Cares, a Carpenter Technology Corporation program that encourages Carpenter employee voluntarism in support of community projects and community services, and the Berks Conservancy are interested in proactive participation by private citizens and companies to improve the quality of life of the City of Reading and surrounding communities, which is home to their respective operations. The Schuylkill River Trail from Philadelphia to Pottsville by way of Reading will follow the Union Canal Trail out of Reading. Carpenter Cares and the Conservancy and the Schuylkill River Greenway Association are also cooperating in signing the Schuylkill River Trail in and through Reading.
